ADULT EDUCATION

Classes available include Stewards of Children, Bullying, The Protective Factors, Recognizing and Responding to Child Abuse & Neglect, Impact of Trauma on The Developing Brain, and Understanding and Preventing Adverse Childhood Experiences and Trauma. PERSONAL SAFETY EDUCATION B.E. S.M.A.R.T.

Multi-session, school-based education programs for children including topics such as good, bad and secret touches; safe people; and safety rules. Interactive activities enhance learning. Follow-up materials, including Parent Tip Sheets, are provided to teachers and families to reinforce learning. Follow up after six weeks demonstrates continued retention of materials discussed.

FOSTER PARENT TRAINING PROGRAM

Available in Kent, Sussex and New Castle County, PCAD provides the required 30hours pre-service education for prospective foster parents (DFS provides the first three hours of the pre-service training). The education reviews the various stages of development for infant through teen years. Upon becoming a foster parent, in-service education is also required and provided by PCAD. Specialized training is provided to individual families who want to provide kinship care.

HOME VISITING PROGRAM

Wrap-around training which is designed to help develop competencies needed to serve young children and their families. Available to Delaware Home Visitors, Health Ambassadors, Help Me Grown Call Center Staff, and Parent Educators.

- 95 home visitors, health ambassadors, parent educators and staff were educated
 - 6 workshops provided
- 38 supervisors partipated in 6 workshops
